

Home Birth Informed Consent

I _____ am aware that only a registered midwife or licensed physician may conduct homebirths in British Columbia. My caregiver has discussed with me the following information:

- the potential benefits of home birth,
- the risks associated with home birth,
- the alternatives to home birth, including the option of giving birth in hospital with a registered midwife or family physician in attendance,
- the standard procedures and emergency measures that may be used by a caregiver assisting with home birth,
- the standard procedures and emergency measures available in the hospital that will not be available at a home birth, without transport to hospital,
- the criteria when transport from home to hospital is indicated,
- the situations when transfer of care to a consultant physician would be appropriate and the procedures for carrying out a transfer with the midwife or family physician remaining in a supportive role, and
- the inability to predict birth outcome in any setting.

I have received and had the opportunity to read and discuss with my caregiver the Place of Birth Handbook.

As a client planning a home birth:

- I will give my caregivers all relevant information about my health status or other circumstances that could potentially affect the health or safety of giving birth at home,
- I agree to transport to hospital during labour or the immediate postpartum should problems arise that cannot be safely managed outside of a hospital.
- I understand that planning a home birth will not ensure me a home birth,
- I understand that I can change my plan at any time, and choose to give birth in hospital with the support of my caregiver.
- I understand that all information about myself and my baby will be kept confidential, except as required by law, and will be subject to the privacy protections of the BC Personal Information Protection Act,
- I understand that some of the information I provide will be submitted to the Perinatal Services BC (PSBC), a program of the Provincial Health Services Authority, for inclusion in a provincial perinatal data registry.
 - o The data submitted will be kept confidential, except as required by law, and will be afforded the privacy protections of the BC Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.
 - o The data submitted will be used to evaluate perinatal outcomes, care processes, and resources, ultimately improving maternal, fetal and newborn care in British Columbia.

My caregiver has answered all of my questions concerning home birth to my satisfaction.
